• Expanding access in a contracting economy

The economic downturn of the last few years has resulted in higher education institutions being challenged to find ways of maintaining their competitive edge and increasing access to the programmes offered to current and prospective students. Greater access to tertiary education by students equates to increased enrolment and higher levels of income for the institution. This strand explores cost-effective measures that may be adopted to expand student access to higher education in Trinidad and Tobago.

• Novel initiatives to ensure sustainability and financial viability

Many institutions locally have recorded a reduction in student enrolment, particularly over the last year. This has resulted in decreased income, forcing some institutions to adopt cost-cutting measures such as the closure of sites and reduction of staff. Institutions are now forced to think out of the box and to devise and adopt creative approaches to managing their operations in order to survive financially. This strand explores the innovative approaches that may be adopted to ensure sustainability of the operations and the financial health of the institution.

• Enhancing the student learning experience in a dynamic environment

In recent years, the local higher education landscape has experienced, and continues to experience, changes to which institutions must adapt without compromising their quality. As the primary stakeholder, students play a major role in promoting an institution based on their experience at that institution. It is therefore incumbent upon institutions to ensure that the student experience is unique, memorable, fulfilling and meaningful. This strand explores approaches that can be adopted to capture and retain the students' interest in pursuing studies at an institution in spite of the economic and other challenges in the current environment.

CALL FOR PAPERS: Requirements for Submission

A. Submissions should include an abstract that is relevant to one of the strands.

Abstracts for Papers should be no more than **250 words** prepared in 12-point Times New Roman font. This should be accompanied by a cover page with the following details:

- 2. Title of Paper
- 3. Author(s): List each author's full name and designation
- 4. Name of institution
- 5. Email address(es) of author(s)
