During 2011, ACTT's Board of Directors, Management Team and members of staff worked diligently to ensure that ACTT realised its vision, mission and core values.

The Board took all the necessary steps to ensure the smooth operations of ACTT. This entailed for example, the filling of vacant positions. Of particular note was the appointmet of the Executive Director. In addition, the Board was able to oversee the recruitment and appointment of two (2)Accreditation Officers, along with the Director of Accreditation and Ouality Enhancement. These appointments were crtitical to the operations of ACTT as these

positions carry the responsibility of guiding institutions in conducting self analyses to determine eligibility for Registration, Accreditation, Conferment of Title and Programme Approval.

One milestone achievement during 2011 was the granting of Institutional Accreditation to three (3) public higher education institutions, the first to be accredited by ACTT in Trinidad and Tobago and the first institutions to have been awarded Institutional Accreditation in the Caribbean, by an accrediting body from within the region.

The Board has also recognised ACTT's duty to comply with various statutory requirements pertaining to its operations. As such, the Board ensured the establishment of a Safety and Health Committee at ACTT. This was in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Act, Chapter. 88:08. Further, The Board continued to push ACTT's innovative capacity by facilitating the development and launch of ACTT's on-line Compendium of Registered, Accredited and Recognised Institutions, Awarding Bodies and Programmes for the period 2011 to 2012.

The Board aims to ensure that ACTT is a future focussed organisation which fosters a culture of innovation while improving organisational performance and ensuring sustainability and growth. Michael Bradshaw, a scholarship winner, is a graduate of The University of the West Indies and possesses a Cert. Ed. (Science), BEd. (1st. Class Hon.), MEd. Administration, MPhil. Leadership and PhD. Educational Leadership (Cand.). He also holds a Teachers' Diploma (Dist.) and Certificates in Project, Human Resource and Quality Management and is at present pursuing a Doctor of Business Administration Degree (Change Management).

Prior to assuming the position of Executive Director, ACTT, he served as Director, Accreditation and Quality Enhancement, as well as in several senior positions in the education and training sector. These include the National Training Agency, Secondary Education Modernisation Programme Coordinating Unit, Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Science, Technology and Tertiary Education. He also served as a Lecturer, UWI School of Education and Lecturer/Course Coordinator, UWI Distance Education Centre (Open Campus).

Mr. Bradshaw also worked extensively as an Education Consultant in the Region and the Commonwealth. At present, he serves as Vice Chairman of the Commonwealth of Learning, Virtual University Qualifications Framework Committee. He is a member of several regional and international quality assurance bodies. He recently completed a term (2009-2011) as Vice Chairman of the Caribbean Area Network for Quality Assurance in Tertiary Education (CANQATE) and serves in an advisory capacity for many other associations and organisations.

### Address from the Executive Director

2011 has been a record breaking year for ACTT. Our achievements include institutional accreditation of three public tertiary level institutions, namely College of Science, Technology & Applied Arts of Trinidad and Tobago. The University of Trinidad and Tobago and The University of the West Indies. St. Augustine Campus. This landmark achievement was cause for celebration on two counts, as it was the first award of Institutional Accreditation in the country as well as the first in the region. ACTT also successfully hosted its first National Conference during Quality Assurance Month, attracting a number of papers presented over the two days.

In its efforts to make ACTT and its services more accessible to the people and to support the printed edition, ACTT launched an online version of its Compendium of Registered, Accredited and Recognised Institutions, Awarding Bodies and Programmes 2011-2012. ACTT continues to reach out to remote areas of the country and, as such, launched its Student Caravan at the lere High School. The Student Caravan has been transporting the ACTT name and its services across the country.

It is expected that 2012 will be another successful year with regard to ACTTs activities. One of those promising and highly anticipated successes is the conclusion of the Institutional Accreditation process by several of the current candidates for accreditation. ACTT also proposes to expand its reach with the intended launch of a Student Caravan in our sister isle of Tobago, as well as to re-launch the Trinidad Student Caravan with a larger, improved vehicle. ACTT is an advocate for the generation and dissemination of knowledge and it is in that light that ACTT will launch a



refereed journal on quality assurance in higher education. It is also anticipated that ACTT will make headway in the development of the National Qualification and Credit Framework. It is anticipated that this will alleviate some of the difficulties encountered by students seeking to further their education. One can rest assured that ACTT and its staff will continue to protect students and regulate the industry in keeping with international best practice.











### **Quality** Assurance Month2011

Quality Assurance (QA) Month organised by the Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago focused on the theme of 'Promoting a Culture of Quality Through Continuous Improvement of the Higher Education Sector'. Spanning the months of October and November 2011, ACTT organised student caravans to secondary schools, community outreach initiatives, an External Evaluator Workshop, a workshop on the Forensics of Acardemic and C.V. Fraud and a Panel Discussion entitled 'The Role of the State in the Provision of Higher Education'. These events were intended to educate and sensitise the public and to promote issues relating to quality in higher education.

During QA Month November 2011, ACTT achieved another milestone in hosting its 1st National Conference on Quality in Higher Education. Twenty -three (23) papers were presented by local practitioners in the higher education sector in Trinidad and Tobago.

This year's Quality Assurance Month culminated in the Quality in Tertiary Education Awards (QuITE) Ceremony, which was held on Friday November 18, 2011 at the National Academy for the Performing Arts (NAPA). The QuITE Awards not only recognise excellence in quality assurance, but also provide tertiary institutions with an incentive to strive for improvement of their quality management systems, thus developing and enhancing the higher education sector of Trinidad and Tobago.

In addition to these awards, ACTT also presented the Lifetime Achievement for Excellence in Higher Education Quality Assurance Award 2011 to Dr. Sandra Gift, Senior Progamme Officer, Quality Assurance Unit, The University of the West Indies St. Augustine. Dr. Gift has over several decades, made sterling contributions to the development and advancement of quality assurance systems, policies and processes for tertiary education. Dr. Gift is an educator and administrator with 28 years experience in the field of education and development regionally and internationally. Senator the Honourable Fazal Karim, Minister of Science, Technology and Tertiary Education presented Dr. Gift with her award.

### ACTT NOW



The Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago has recognised the need to foster nationalism and patriotism amongst members of staff. In this regard, the Council held a ceremony to celebrate our nationhood, which included recognising Independence and Republic Days, two holidays that signify our growth as a nation. This year was indeed a special one for ACTT and was reflected in the choice of feature speaker, fondly referred to as Mr. Tim Tim in the storytelling world. Paul Keens-Douglas is one of the most eloquent and best-known raconteurs and social commentators in the English-speaking Caribbean and therefore brought the necessary skills and experience to enlighten the staff on the importance of being a proud Trinbagonian in a globalised society. He expounded on family as a major aspect of nation building and described nationhood as a feeling of togetherness, a sense of belonging to a unique group. He added to the theme of nation-building stating that we are responsible

for the next generation and must all be leaders. He further stated that to be a leader is to recognise the combined talent of people, understand the changing world, uphold standards and have happy families.

In addition to thought provoking commentary from Mr. Keens-Douglas, Dr. Michael Dowlath, Chairman of the Board of Directors, ACTT, remarked on the significance of the day since at its 10th meeting of the Board of Directors a decision was taken to appoint Mr. Michael Bradshaw to the post of Executive Director. He also praised Mr. Bradshaw and staff for their dedication to the maintenance of quality and integrity in the Council since its inception. He illustrated the importance of ownership to staff, to own problems, use their skills and be driven to find solutions. He stressed that each member of staff was especially chosen for a purpose, as their job is not routine. He stated, "We are here to make a difference in the lives of people who depend on us and we must be patriotic and focused on uplifting the country".

At this event, the Members of the Board of Directors and the Executive Leadership Team presented ACTT's Ideal Citizen's Award 2011 to Zellon Bethel. The 8th Annual Conference of the Caribbean Area Network for Quality Assurance in Tertiary Education (CANQATE) was held at the Sheraton Hotel, Nassau, Bahamas, from October 5-7, 2011. The theme, 'Enhancing Access to Tertiary Education in a Globalized Environment: The Quality Imperative', focussed on issues related to tertiary education and its significance in the global environment. There were approximately twenty-seven (27) presentations delivered over the two-day (2) period. All presenters were committed to enhancing the educational capacity of the Caribbean region.

The keynote speaker at the opening ceremony, Professor David Woodhouse, as well as a number of presenters, spoke at length about the importance of fostering the educational capabilities of the Caribbean, ensuring student retention and utilising ICT as a core component towards achieving competitive advantage in the education sector.

An underlying theme of the two-day conference was the importance of gathering data and conducting research on higher education and ensuring that the information gathered is used to guide decision-making. This conference encouraged the participants to conduct research that will be beneficial to the Caribbean.
