# Executive Director'smessage

Quality assurance is the central component of ACTT's operations and this is demonstrated by our steadfast commitment to educational planning, monitoring and evaluating, student satisfaction and institutional change in Trinidad and Tobago. Significant activity such as documentation of best practices, organisation of workshops and the production of educational materials, takes place within government agencies involved in the delivery of higher education programmes. ACTT continues to spearhead activities that are fundamental to the development of Trinidad and Tobago's higher education sector. These activities are critical as we work towards achieving our vision of being the principal authority in Trinidad and Tobago for quality assurance and continuous improvement in higher education and a leader in innovation and best practice. In the past 6 months we have extended our reach through the opening of a new office in South Trinidad as well as re-commissioning our Tobago office and launching the first Tobago Student Caravan. In addition to this ACTT has recently awarded Institutional Accreditation to 2 higher education institutions, bringing the total number of accredited institutions in Trinidad and Tobago to five.

ACTT opened its South Outreach Office at #108 Independence Avenue, San Fernando, on Saturday April 28, 2012. The establishment of this office is in keeping with the objectives of ACTT's Community Southern Caribbean (USC) was also awarded Outreach Initiatives to improve access to our services throughout Institutional Accreditation. USC is the first Trinidad and Tobago.

ACTT re-commissioned its Tobago office and launched its Tobago this status from a quality assurance agency. # **ACTT Launches its Tobago Student Caravan**











Senator the Honourable Fazal Karim, Minister of Science Technology and Tertiary Education (MSTTE), attended a ribbon-cutting ceremony hosted by the Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago (ACTT) on June 1st 2012 at the Tobago Technology Centre, to recommission its Tobago Office and launch its Tobago Student Caravan and Digital Map of Registered and Accredited Institutions.

In re-commissioning the office, Senator the Honourable Fazal Karim, stated that ACTT's office will benefit the people of Tobago by offering services in real time. He described ACTT's Tobago Student Caravan as integral in providing optimal service to youths, especially students preparing for the next step of higher education, and to other community-based organisations.

Mr Jaggernauth Soom, Permanent Secretary, MSTTE, stated that citizens would continue to have direct access to technical advice and expertise from ACTT. In addition, the office would facilitate more effective monitoring of institutions located in Tobago.

Several members of the Tobago House of Assembly were also present, including Councillor Huey Cadette, Assistant Secretary of Education, Youth Affairs and Sport who spoke on behalf of the Honourable Orville London, Chief Secretary, Tobago House of Assembly. Councillor Cadette stated that ACTT's Student Caravan would assist in meeting the needs of citizens in remote areas who may not have access to internet services and congratulated ACTT for its commitment to developing modern interfaces.

Mr Ashworth Jack, Minority Leader of the Tobago House of Assembly, congratulated the Accreditation Council for opening a permanent home in Tobago and reiterated the government's plan to decentralise services, ensuring that Tobago is an equal partner. He further urged students present to take advantage of ACTT's services before pursuing higher education.

Dr Michael Dowlath, Chairman, ACTT reconfirmed the organisation's dedication to Tobago and indicated that that the management and staff believe that equipping students with information on quality higher education will ensure that informed decisions are made when selecting a higher education institution and programme of study. Dr Dowlath also launched ACTT's Digital Map of Registered and Accredited institutions in Trinidad and Tobago and noted that this map, located on ACTT's website www.actt.org.tt, identified ACTT's 70 registered and 5 accredited institutions located in the twin island Republic.

On Monday May 21, 2012, the Minister of Science, Technology and Tertiary Education, Senator the Honourable Fazal Kairm, presented the Certificate of Institutional Accreditation to the University of the Southern Caribbean (USC) in a formal ceremony held at the Ministry's headquarters at the International Waterfront Center, Wrightson Road, Port of Spain.

In his keynote address, Senator Karim spoke about the importance of accreditation and its benefits. He stated that "Accreditation is based on the principles of a quality management system." Further, he added that it "turns concerns into confidence" and "moves faith into the future". Senator Karim congratulated the President of USC, Dr. Clinton Valley, on the achievement of Institutional Accreditation and urged the university to produce graduates through teaching, learning and research, upon which the strengths of universities are built, to match the needs of our labour market.

Other speakers at the event included Dr Michael Dowlath, Chairman, ACTT and Dr Clinton Valley, President, USC. In his opening remarks, Dr Dowlath commented on the historical significance of the occasion stating that USC is the fifth institution to be granted Institutional Accreditation by ACTT, and the first private and faith-based university in Trinidad and Tobago and the southern Caribbean to achieve this milestone.

In his remarks, Dr Clinton Valley stated that USC remains committed to providing for this country, the region and the graduates who make a significant, productive and qualitative difference to the environment wherever they live and work.
