ACTT confers Continuing Institutional Accreditation on Four Institutions

The Accreditation Council of Trinidad and Tobago (ACTT) is pleased to announce that the Council, at its meeting held on August 26, 2026, approved the award of status of Continuing Institutional Accreditation to the following four institutions:

- **MIC Institute of Technology** – September 26, 2025 to September 25, 2030
- **NESC Technical Institute** – December 06, 2024 to December 05, 2029
- **The University of Trinidad and Tobago** – December 17, 2025 to December 16, 2032; and
- **UWI School of Business and Applied Studies Limited** – August 08, 2025 to August 07, 2032.

The conferment of Continuing Institutional Accreditation is a significant achievement and reflects these institutions' demonstrated commitment to quality and their continued efforts to meet the standards established by ACTT for Institutional Accreditation in Trinidad and Tobago.

Importantly, these institutions are among several higher education providers that have engaged in and are currently undergoing ACTT's institutional accreditation process. Upon successful completion, their accreditation status will likewise be conferred in accordance with the applicable requirements.

Professor Indar Ramnarine, Chairman of ACTT, has commended the leadership, faculty, staff and other stakeholders of the four institutions on this achievement, also stating: *"ACTT remains committed to promoting quality, accountability and continuous improvement within the post-secondary and tertiary education sector.
